

## **Compliance program**

#### Introduction

Parks Australia's (PA) compliance program aims to achieve high levels of compliance by marine park users with the rules set out in the management plans. The program implements strategies and undertakes compliance actions that focus on achieving voluntary compliance through improving awareness and prevention, effective detection (surveillance and monitoring) and deterrence outcomes. The application of these strategies is informed using a risk-based approach, which enables the targeting of compliance priorities with informed decision-making and responses.

#### Risk assessments

Compliance risk assessments and evaluations are undertaken on an annual basis for each network of marine parks and the Coral Sea Marine Park to identify compliance risk sources and assess priorities. This information informs the preparation of annual network compliance plans, which in turn define the suite of actions that are to be undertaken by PA to address compliance risks.

## Incident detection and activity monitoring

Compliance incidents in Australian Marine Parks (AMP) are detected through a number of sources including:

- Aerial surveillance Maritime Border Command (MBC), the Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA), PA charter flights and state government partnership arrangements
- Vessel patrols Australian Border Force (ABF) / MBC and state government partnership arrangements
- Vessel Monitoring System Australian Fisheries Management Authority (AFMA) and state government partnership arrangements
- Acoustic monitoring Sound traps
- **Direct reporting** General public (1800 calls or emails) and reports from state or Commonwealth agencies.

## **Enforcement response**

Deterrence of illegal activity through appropriate enforcement action is essential and is guided by the Enforcement Guidelines for Commonwealth Marine Protected Areas. Enforcement action is taken commensurate with the severity of the offence and may include:

- Administrative actions are used for minor offences and includes warning notices, advisory letters, infringement notices or cancellation of a permit or approval.
- Civil actions are used to reflect the need for economic deterrence to non-compliance and seeks to
  redress the harm done as a result of contraventions. Civil actions are initiated by the Minister and
  heard in the Federal Court.
- Criminal actions are used when offences involve significant environmental harm, serious intent or
  recklessness or repeat serious offenders. A person issued with a penalty infringement notice may
  elect to not pay an infringement notice and to have the matter heard in court.

## **Compliance information sensitivities**

Due to the nature and sensitivity of the information used to create this document, some information including maritime patrols and aerial surveillance frequency and location have not been included or aggregated to protect the tactics, methodology and integrity of PA's compliance program and our various partner agencies.

If you witness or know about any illegal activity within an AMP, we urge you to report this activity.

#### **Authorisations**

- 1 x charter fishing vessel sighted by aerial surveillance potentially fishing within Argo-Rowley Terrace SPZ. Investigation identified no evidence of a breach, no further action. Date: 28 October.
- 2 x yachts moored without mooring booking in Mermaid Reef NPZ. Investigations ongoing. Date: 13 November.

#### **Commercial fishing**

- 2 x AFV sighted by aerial surveillance potentially fishing within West Cape York HPZ. Investigation identified no evidence of a breach, no further action. Date: 2 October.
- 1 x AFV identified by VMS alert potentially fishing within Wessel HPZ. Investigation identified no evidence of a breach, no further action. Date: 5 October.
- 1 x AFV identified by VMS alert potentially fishing within Oceanic Shoals MUZ. Investigation identified no evidence of a breach, no further action. Date: 9 October.
- 1 x AFV self-reported potentially fishing within Coral Sea HPZ. Investigation ongoing. Date: 9 November.

#### **Charter Fishing**

1 x PIN issued to charter vessel identified by surface patrol fishing within Two Rocks NPZ. Date: 23 October.

#### **Recreational Fishing**

- 1 x recreational fishing vessel sighted by aerial surveillance fishing within Oceanic Shoals NPZ. Vessel unable to be identified, no further action. Date: 15 October.
- 3 x PINs issued to recreational fishing vessels sighted by aerial surveillance fishing within Pimpernel Rock NPZ. Date: 5 and 9 November.
- 2 x recreational fishing vessels sighted by aerial surveillance fishing within Cod Grounds NPZ. Investigations ongoing. Date: 6 and 10 December.

#### **Foreign Fishing**

- 243 x FFV's sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol within the Argo-Rowley Terrace MUZ. Response was requested, resulting in 34 x legislative forfeitures of catch and gear and 11 vessels seized and disposed of.
- 84 x FFV's sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol within the Mermaid Reef NPZ. Response was requested, resulting in 20 x legislative forfeitures of catch and gear and 1 vessel seized and disposed of.
- 69 x FFV's sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol within the Argo-Rowley Terrace SPZ. Response was requested, resulting in 36 x legislative forfeitures of catch and gear.

- 48 x FFV's sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol within the Cartier Island SZ. Response was requested, resulting in 14 x legislative forfeitures of catch and gear, 1 vessel seized and disposed of and 1 x educational boarding.
- 36 x FFV's sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol within the Ashmore Reef SZ and RUZ. Response was requested, resulting in 22 x legislative forfeitures of catch and gear and 1 x vessel seized and disposed of.
- 13 x FFV's sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol within the Argo-Rowley Terrace NPZ. Response was requested, however nil assets were available.
- 12 x FFV's sighted by aerial surveillance within the Kimberley MUZ. Response was requested, resulting in 1 x legislative forfeiture of catch and gear.
- 5 x FFV's sighted by aerial surveillance within Oceanic Shoals SPZ. Response was requested, resulting in 2 x legislative forfeitures of catch and gear.

#### **Ghost Nets**

# **Ongoing matters**

#### **Cases**

1 x AFV identified by VMS alert and air surveillance allegedly conducting commercial fishing activity within the Oceanic Shoals MUZ in 2018. Legal proceedings have commenced in this matter.

## **Outcomes**



#### **Legislative Forfeitures**

36 x legislative forfeitures performed by AFMA on FFVs sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol in the Argo-Rowley Terrace SPZ.

34 x legislative forfeitures performed by AFMA on FFVs sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol in the Argo-Rowley Terrace MUZ, and 11 vessels seized and disposed of.

22 x legislative forfeitures performed by AFMA on FFVs sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol in the Ashmore Island SZ and RUZ, and 1 vessel seized and disposed of.

20 x legislative forfeitures performed by AFMA on FFVs sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol in the Mermaid Reef NPZ, and 1 vessel seized and disposed of.

14 x legislative forfeitures performed by AFMA on FFVs sighted by aerial surveillance and surface patrol in the Cartier Island SZ, 1 vessel seized and disposed of and 1 x educational boarding.

2 x legislative forfeitures performed by AFMA on FFVs sighted by aerial surveillance in Oceanic Shoals MUZ.

1 x legislative forfeiture performed by AFMA on an FFV sighted by aerial surveillance in the Kimberley MUZ.

3 x PINs issued to recreational fishers identified by aerial surveillance fishing in Pimpernel Rock NPZ.

2 x PINs issued to recreational fishers identified by aerial surveillance fishing in Cod Grounds NPZ.2

1 x PIN issued to charter fishing company identified by surface patrol fishing in Two Rocks NPZ.

2 x yachts moored without authorisation in Mermaid Reef NPZ. Investigations ongoing. Date: 13 November.



## **Appendix: footnotes**

#### 1 VMS alerts

The Parks alert service is a free tool established in partnership with AFMA aimed at avoiding non-compliance in AMPs. When a vessel enters an AMP where the nominated primary gear type is not allowed, an alert message is sent to PA and to the fishing vessels nominated contact via email and/or as an SMS message to a nominated phone. PA conducts assessments of all VMS alerts and takes appropriate action if illegal activity is suspected. Fishing vessels must transit at more than 5 knots through an AMP NPZ.

#### 2 RFI notices

When PA suspects that a breach of the EPBC Act may have occurred, a request for information (RFI) may be sent to the alleged offender allowing them the opportunity to explain their actions, in accordance with natural justice principles.


An investigation into suspected offences may highlight the need for additional information and RFI's may be used to obtain information for this purpose.

## 3 FFVs in prohibited areas and educational boarding's

The traditional fishing practices of Indonesian fishers are recognised in a memorandum of understanding (MOU) between Australia and Indonesia. The MOU allows fishing of a specified area, adjacent to the Ashmore Reef and Cartier Island Marine Parks (Sanctuary Zones), by Indonesian fishers using traditional means (sail powered) for specific species. Vessels are not permitted to enter Sanctuary Zones; however, variable weather conditions and force majeure situations may impact on sail powered vessels leading to illegal transit through prohibited areas.

MBC conducts investigative boardings of FFVs in the MOU box to ensure compliance with Australian laws. FFVs found to be compliant with Australian laws will generally be provided with educational materials. Non-compliant FFVs may be issued warnings for minor breaches whereas more serious matters may lead to criminal prosecutions and forfeiture/destruction of the fishing vessel involved in the offence.

AFMA leads investigations and prosecutions into illegal fishing matters in AMPs with support from PA for EPBC Act offences.
